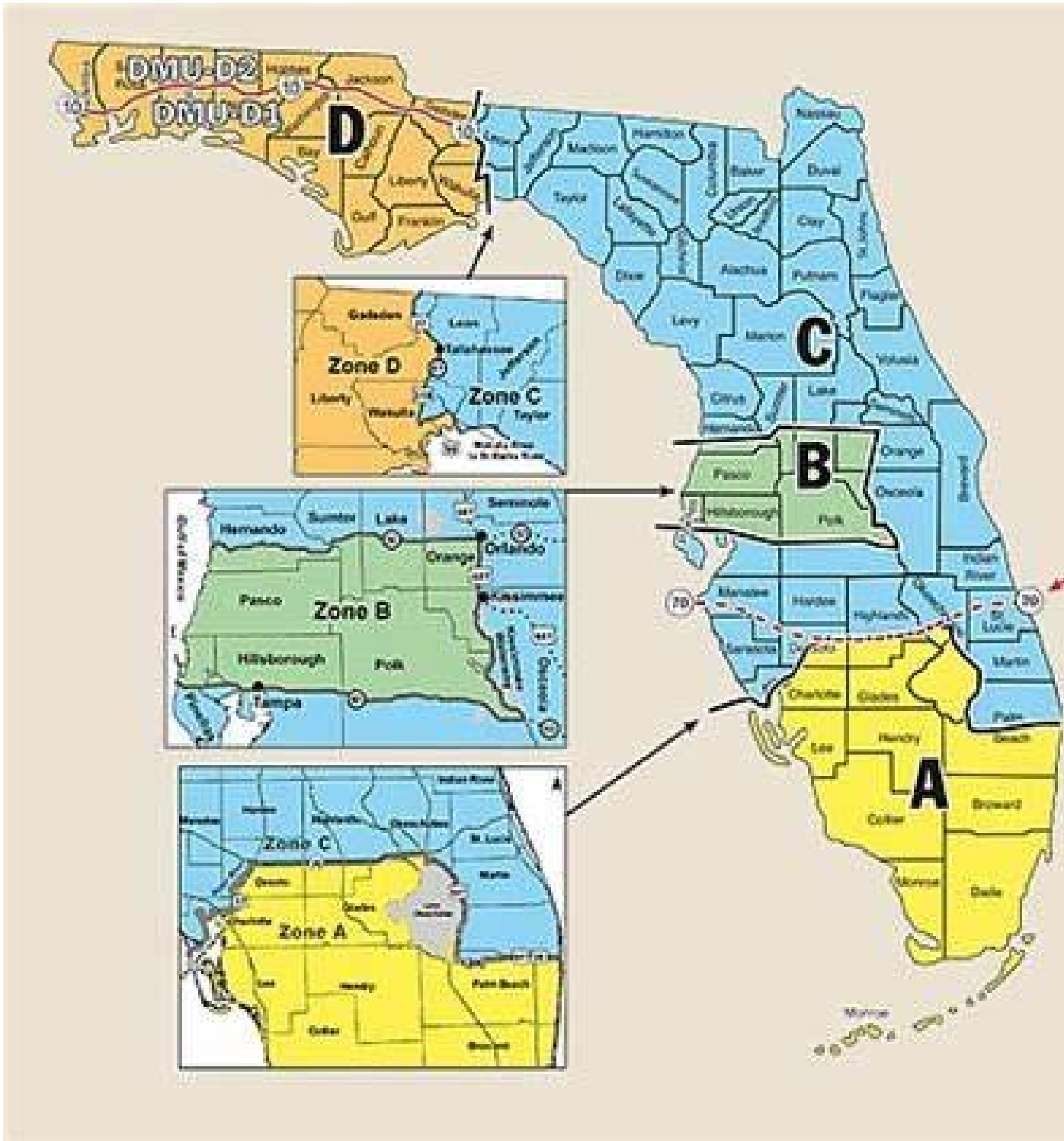

DMU-C

Antler Regulations

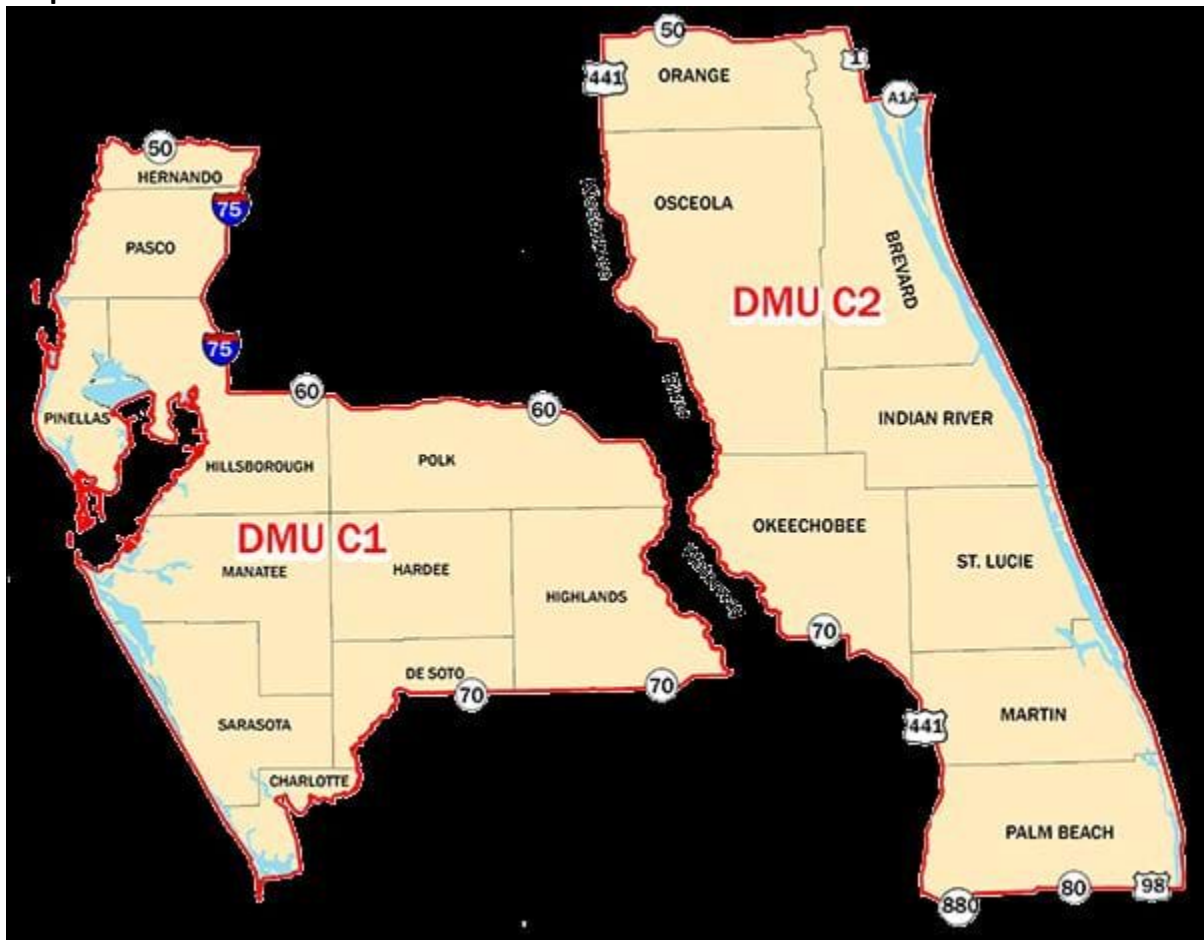
DMU-C1, C2

To be legal to take, all antlered deer (deer with at least one antler 5 inches or longer) must have an antler with 1) at least 3 points with each point measuring one inch or more OR 2) a main beam length of 10 inches or more. Hunters 16 years of age and older may not take during any season or by any method an antlered deer not meeting this criteria.

As part of their annual statewide antlered deer bag limit, youth 15-years-old and younger may harvest 1 deer annually not meeting antler criteria but having at least 1 antler 5 inches or more in length.

Map and Boundaries



DMU-C1 –The western boundary is the Gulf of Mexico. The northern boundary is Hwy 50 then it turns south and follows Interstate 75 to Hwy 60. It turns east on Hwy 50 to its intersection with the Kissimmee River. It follows the Kissimmee River south to S.R. 70. It then follows S.R. 70 west to the Peace River. Then it follows the Peace River and the Charlotte Harbor to the Gulf of Mexico.

DMU-C2 – The western boundary follows U.S. 441 south to the Kissimmee River Waterway. The northern boundary is Hwy 50 to U.S. 1; south on U.S. 1 till it follows the Bennett Causeway/Hwy 528/Hwy A1A east to the Atlantic Ocean. The eastern boundary is the Atlantic Ocean. The southern boundary follows S.R. 70, running east until it meets U.S. 441 north of Lake Okeechobee; it then follows U.S. 441 south, where it proceeds around the eastern shore of Lake Okeechobee; the line then turns off U.S. 441 and onto S.R. 80 and runs just a few miles before turning east and becoming County Road 880, running just a few miles before joining back up with U.S. 98/441/S.R. 80/Southern Blvd., where it continues east all the way to the Atlantic Ocean.

Antler Regulations

DMU-C3 (NO DOES MY BE TAKEN IN CRANE BAY WITHOUT PERMIT)

To be legal to take, all antlered deer (deer with at least one antler 5 inches or longer) must have an antler with at least 2 points with each point measuring one inch or more. Hunters 16 years of age and older may not take during any season or by any method an antlered deer not meeting this criteria.

As part of their annual statewide antlered deer bag limit, youth 15-years-old and younger may harvest 1 deer annually not meeting antler criteria but having at least 1 antler 5 inches or more in length.

DMU-C4, C5, C6

To be legal to take, all antlered deer (deer with at least one antler 5 inches or longer) must have an antler with 1) at least 3 points with each point measuring one inch or more OR 2) a main beam length of 10 inches or more. Hunters 16 years of age and older may not take during any season or by any method an antlered deer not meeting this criteria.

Map and Boundaries



DMU-C3 –The western boundary is Hwy 61 south to U.S. 319 to U.S Hwy 98, east along U.S. 98 to the Wakulla River, south along the river to St. Marks River and on to the Gulf of Mexico. The northern/eastern boundary begins in Tallahassee on U.S. 19/27 to Perry where it follows U.S. 27 to High Springs then turns south along U.S. 27/41 till Brooksville where it then turns west along Hwy 50 and then onto Bayport and the Gulf of Mexico.

DMU-C4 –The western boundary beginning in High Springs and going south along U.S. 41 till Brooksville. The northern boundary begins in High Springs and follows U.S. 441 to Gainesville, then east along Hawthorne Rd/Hwy 20 to Palatka, then along U.S. 17 to Hwy 20/Hwy 100 through Bunnell and to the Atlantic Ocean. The eastern boundary is the Atlantic Ocean. The southern boundary beginning in Brooksville goes east along Hwy 50 to U.S. 1; south on U.S. 1 till it follows the Bennett Causeway/Hwy 528/Hwy A1A east to the Atlantic Ocean.

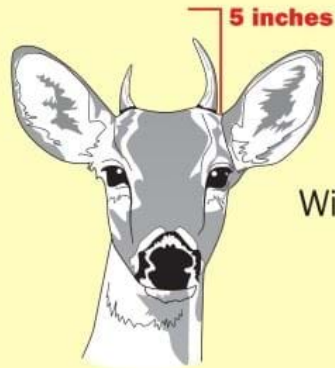
DMU-C5 –The western boundary is U.S. 27. The northern boundary is the Florida/Georgia line. The eastern boundary follows Interstate 75. The southern boundary begins in Tallahassee on U.S. 19/27 to Perry where it follows U.S. 27 to High Springs then follows U.S. 441 to Interstate 75.

DMU-C6 –The western boundary is Interstate 75. The northern boundary is the Florida/Georgia line. The eastern boundary is the Atlantic Ocean. The southern boundary beginning at the intersection of Interstate 75 and U.S. 441 follows U.S. 441 to Gainesville, then continues east along Hawthorne Rd/Hwy 20 to Palatka, then goes along U.S. 17 to Hwy 20/Hwy 100 through Bunnell and to the Atlantic Ocean.

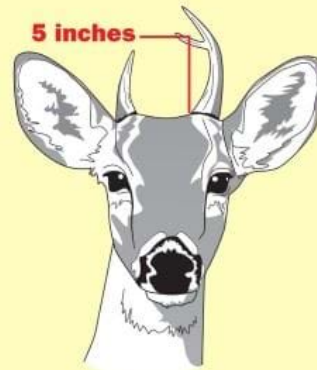


Antler Examples



Antlerless deer

less than 5 inches

2 points-on-a-side antlered deer
At least one antler with 2 points,
each point 1 inch or more in length



3 points-on-a-side antlered deer
At least one antler with 3 points,
each point 1 inch or more in length

**Length of main beam
at least 10 inches long**

10-inch main beam antlered deer
At least one main beam 10 inches
or more in length

Zone A

- Archery season: July 30 – Aug. 28
- Crossbow season: July 30 – Sept. 2

Zone C

Zone D

- Muzzleloading gun season: Dec. 3–9, Feb. 20–26

ANTLERLESS DEER – deer (except spotted fawn) without antlers or antlers less than 5 inches (IF PERMITTED BY CLUB)

Zone D

Bag Limit

Daily bag limit: 2 deer

- During those portions of archery and crossbow seasons when antlerless deer can be taken, either deer may be antlered or antlerless.
- During those portions of muzzleloading gun and general gun seasons when antlerless deer may be taken, only 1 deer may be antlerless.
- During all other seasons, only antlered deer may be taken. Antlerless deer can only be taken by antlerless deer permit/tag.

Possession limit: 4 deer

Annual bag limit: 5 deer of which only 2 can be antlerless

NOTE: Deer taken on private lands under the Antlerless Deer Permit Program (antlerless deer only), Private Lands Deer Management Permit Program and Deer Depredation Permit Program and on licensed game farms and hunting preserves are excluded from bag (daily and annual) and possession limits.

Deer Dog Training Season

Zone A: Aug. 13 – Sept. 1

Zone B: Oct. 29 - Nov. 17

Zone C: Oct. 1–20

Zone D: Oct. 29 – Nov. 17

* Youth deer hunt weekend

Youth 15-years-old and younger can harvest any deer except spotted fawn, but youth must be supervised by an adult, 18 years or older. Youth may use any legal method of take (including dogs) for deer, with a limit of 1 deer for the weekend that counts towards the youth's annual statewide bag limit. *This weekend does not apply to wildlife management areas.*
